In the wake of tragedy

Sudbury puts sticks out for Humboldt

Greater Sudbury has joined the rest of the world in showing support for the Humboldt Broncos in the wake of the fatal bus crash on April 6.

Thousands of people have joined in the #SticksOutforHumboldt movement that swept Canada and parts of the U.S. Residents are putting hockey sticks outside their doors to honour the 15 players killed in the crash. Many hockey teams in the city have wrapped their own sticks with green tape to show their support.

On Sunday evening, a couple hundred Sudburians gathered outside Sudbury Arena for a vigil, standing in solidarity with those affected by the Humboldt Broncos tragedy.

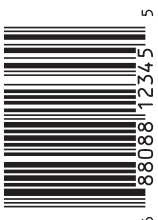
During the Sudbury vigil, organizer Brenda Linney read out the names of those killed and injured in the crash.
